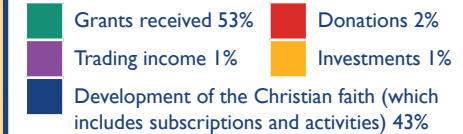


6. The support centre moves to a residential training college to maximise mission relationships
